Mayor Kaplan reported to audience members that the Village Board met earlier this evening for a neighborhood walk. The first walk was on Glenwood Drive where the board met with residents and discussed some of their concerns including were street lights being out and drainage issues.

The second neighborhood walk was on Ida Lane to inspect the damage that occurred recently due to Hurricane Irene. The Village Board would like to explore different options to remedy the damage and traffic safety.

MOTION TO SCHEDULE A PUBLIC HEARING FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY ON IDA LANE #102411-01

<u>Laurie Friedman & Don Mekulik</u> – were before the board tonight to discuss the proposed suspension of parking law on Westwood Avenue.

POLICE

Chief Mattracion informed board members that a mandatory training will take place this coming week end and reminded everyone about the curfew on October 30 & 31.

There will be firearms training for his department on November 12th.

Mayor Kaplan requested that the Street Department be reminded to pick up as many leaves and limbs as possible in the heavily trafficked Halloween areas.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Manager Sheeley spoke about the paving schedule previously approved by the Board, with the addition of Rear Chapel to the paving schedule, we are removing Graham Place from this schedule.

MOTION TO AMEND PAVING SCHEDULE #102411-4

Motion by Deputy Mayor Younger, seconded by Trustee Lopez to amend the 2011 to include Rear Chapel Street at a cost of \$16,676.60 which includes blacktop and the contractor's fee. All in favor - Aye - motion carried

Clinton Avenue Bridge – Manager Sheeley spoke about this bridge reopening and obtained prices to pave Clinton Avenue and they are \$36,000 for blacktop and \$8,000 for the contractor.

Trustee Lopez questioned the status of Ida Lane and Manager Sheeley responded that we are waiting for specifications for repair from our engineers.

Manager Sheeley reported to board members that the trail behind the Sewer Plant has been damaged. Manager Sheeley has spoken to Don Schmalzle, project manager for new plant, and he will have the contractor remove the debris and fix the holes on the trail.

Manager Sheeley followed up on the question if the Village would be eligible for the \$2,000,000 grant from Environmental Facilities if we choose to reduce the size of the project of the water improvement project and it appears we will. Manager Sheeley will keep the board apprised at future meetings.

Mayor Kaplan congratulated the staff and the board of trustees for their diligence and hard work.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Code Enforcer Schug told board members of a dead tree located at 167 S. Main Street and after checking the property owner's survey the tree is on Village property. The Board requested that Mr. Schug get quotes to remove the tree.

HVAC – there are issues with the fourth floor cooling system and it was requested that Mr. Schug get proposals for this matter.
