Mayor Kaplan stated that earlier in the evening the Board of Trustees met at 19 Hillcrest Avenue to review the property owners request for a special use permit. This property is a corner lot which has two front yards and the owner would like to install a six foot fence on both sides. The board does not feel this would be a detriment to the neighborhood and the property owner has agreed to submit a new design proposal.

Mayor Kaplan also stated that New York State law does not allow the banning of specific breeds of dogs, but it is the Village's responsibility to protect the health, safety of well being of our residents.
