#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Trustee Steinhoff, seconded by Trustee Lopez to accept the minutes of September 12, 2011 as presented. All in favor – Aye – motion carried.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Motion by Trustee Steinhoff, seconded by Trustee Lopez to open the public hearing for amending a local law of the Village of Ellenville for the year 2011 §217-46, schedule XI: parking prohibited at all times – to allow for parking on the south side of Westwood Avenue from Linden Street to Laurel Terrace.

A motion by Trustee Steinhoff, seconded by Trustee Lopez to remove §40 – Delete reference to Mountain Avenue Route 52 for the proposed local law. All in favor – Aye – Motion carried.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

Clinton Street Bridge and the speed limit on Chapel Street A motion by Trustee Steinhoff, seconded by Trustee Lopez to reduce the speed limit from 30 to 20mph on Chapel Street and would like the speed limit to stay in effect until the Clinton Street Bridge is repaired and safe to drive on. This will be subject to attorney review. All in favor – Aye – motion carried.

Ellenville Wawarsing Chamber of Commerce – Blueberry Festival – The members of the Ellenville Wawarsing Chamber of Commerce were present at tonight's board meeting. The Chamber of Commerce members would like the Board to ban all dogs and/or any pets from attending this event. The Board suggested that all special events taking place in the Village should ban all pets in the near future and proper posting should be made available. The Board also praised the Chamber on a successful job with the festival.

Infiltration and Inflow System – The Board discussed a five year proposal by Green Mountain in the amount of \$123,000.00 to test pipes and locate cracks within the sewer pipes. Green Mountain would reduce the amount by \$23,000.00 if the Village would pay the total cost up front. Attorney Berger informed the board that regardless of what they decide to do the village would still need to go out to bid for this project.
