	Mayor Kaplan discussed with the Chief the concept of having the police hosting community meetings at several churches in the Village to foster good relations.		

MANAGER'S REPORT

Manager Stoeckeler gave an update on the Village's water project as well as an upcoming meeting with NY Rising. Manager Stoeckeler informed board members of the contingencies set forth by the Environmental Facilities Corporation has given to the Village before the closeout of the Wastewater Treatment Plant project can be completed. The Village must establish a separate water fund and a separate sewer fund bank account. In addition the Village must address the deficit in the Water fund.

With the above in mind, Manager Stoeckeler recommended and gave to board members the following plan by using a portion of the "mountain money" to restructure the Village's financial situation.

Anticipated Outcome:

- 1. Enable Village to stay under Tax Cap for next several years
- 2. Sewer Capital Fee reduced by \$5.00 per quarter for residential users (20% reduction)
- 3. Eliminate quarterly Water Deficit charge (Average reduction expected to be approximately \$35.00 per quarter per house)

The following discussion took place between board members and Manager Stoeckeler. Mayor Kaplan stated that due to interest rates over the past few years, the interest received is minimal. If this money is used it would relieve some of the Village's taxpayers burden for our water/sewer rates as well as qualify for the rebate from the State.

Attorney Berger prepared draft legislation for a local law authorizing to consider the adoption of a Local Law of the Village of Ellenville for the Year 2015 which authorizes the Board of Trustees of the Village to: (i) withdraw a total sum of \$1,200,000.00 from a special reserve fund established for the Village pursuant to Chapter 289 of the Laws of 1997. This legislation will be discussed at a Public Hearing.

MOTION TO SCHEDULE A PUBLIC HEARING FOR LOCAL LAW WITHDRAWAL FROM SPECIAL RESERVE ACCOUNT #012615-2

Motion by Trustee Steinhoff, seconded by Deputy Mayor Younger to schedule a Public Hearing on February 9, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. to consider the adoption of a Local Law of the Village of Ellenville for the Year 2015 which authorizes the Board of Trustees of the Village to: (i) withdraw a total sum of \$1,200,000.00 from a special reserve funds. All in favor - Aye - motion carried

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Building Inspector Schug gave board members a copy of legislation adopted by other municipalities as to how they deal with abandoned homes. Mayor Kaplan questioned if there was legislation that would allow the Village to take measures before the property is in the foreclosure process and requested Attorney Berger to discuss this matter with NY Conference of Mayors.

Building Inspector Schug told board members that a class for Flood Plain Management previously approved by the Board from Maryland to Oriskany, New York.

MOTION TO AMEND AUTHORIZATION TO ATTEND SEMINAR #012615-3

Motion by Trustee Lopez, seconded by Deputy Mayor Younger amending previous authorization for Building Inspector Schug to attend a Flood Plain Management from Maryland to Oriskany, New York at no cost to the Village.
